CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

DEAR MEMBERS

Welcome to Belsize Square's 2024/5785 High Holyday guide! A great number of people are involved in planning and organising our beautiful services and while I won't thank them individually, I would like to acknowledge the time and effort this takes, I am very grateful.

Please take some time to read through this helpful booklet and see what Belsize has to offer this year. In this booklet you'll find details of friends & family tickets, prayer books, parking arrangements, transport, the creche and much more!

Also enclosed are your High Holyday tickets and the synagogue calendar for 2024/25. **Please** note that our Kol Nidrei Service will again start at the earlier time of 6.45pm this year.

Please read through the booklet to understand all that's on offer from the synagogue.

TICKETS & SEATING

Security remains an absolute priority and admission to the services is by ticket only. It should be noted that tickets are named and numbered and are not transferable. Please read on for the 2nd day Rosh Hashanah arrangements. Tickets do not represent a reserved seat as all members have the same right to choose their seats, as at our weekly services. It is advisable to sit in the front section of the sanctuary if you wish to take advantage of our hearing loop system.

DECORUM

To preserve decorum we ask that you're respectful when entering the main service, particularly when the Ark is open, during the sermons, silent prayers and Mazkir on Yom Kippur. Ushers will be in the sanctuary to advise you when it is appropriate to enter and they will direct you to available seats.

COMFORT

Members should note that if the sun is shining the Synagogue can get very warm and so the air conditioning will be on. You may want to bring a cardigan or sweater for comfort as it gets chilly when sitting by an air conditioning unit.

FAMILY SERVICES & KIKAR KIDS

Last year we revamped the Family Services, making them more interactive, inspiring and engaging. We have listened to your feedback and there will be further changes/upgrades this year, including reducing the length of the Services. Family Services will be held during the morning services in the hall, check your tickets for the timings. We hope to be able to admit everyone but as seating is limited, adults will need to be aware of whether space is available. Our second day Rosh Hashanah Family Service will have a more relaxed feel. Please do feedback to us afterwards!

Ilana Banana will lead the under 5s Kikar Kids service in the creche on 1st Day Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur – more details further on in the booklet.

TALLITOT

Gentlemen are respectfully reminded that it is customary for a Tallit to be worn at the Kol Nidrei Service. A small number of Tallitot are available if you do not have one.

WEBCAST

Anyone who comes on to the Bimah for an Aliyah, Ark opening or to take part in the service will appear in our webcast, BelsizeLIVE. If you have a problem appearing on the livestream then unfortunately you will have to decline this invitation. We sincerely hope that this will not be the case.

OFFICE HOURS

As well as normal opening hours, the synagogue office will be open between 10.00-12.00 (noon) on Sunday 29 September to enable you to collect prayer books, parking vouchers and visitor tickets which have been pre-booked.

FRIENDS & FAMILY

Please do tell you friends and family who belong to a Synagogue that keeps only the first day of Rosh Hashanah that they are welcome to join our Rosh Hashanah second day service as long as they are able to show a ticket from their own Synagogue.

TEEN DISCUSSION FORUM

This year on 1st Day Rosh Hashanah & Yom Kippur at 10.15am we are holding a discussion forum for ages 12+ in the marquee area. Join us for a lively debate on Jewish themes.

SUPERWISED PLAY

If you have a child aged between 6-12, there will be a supervised area for you to leave them between 10.00-11.00 on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. This gives you the opportunity to attend the main Service or take a younger sibling to Kikar Kids, before the Family begins at 11.00am.

CRECHE FACILITIES



We will be operating a crèche run by qualified nursery staff for children from 6 months old to 6 years during the daytime High Holyday Services.

Please note that the crèche will **not** operate during the evening services on Rosh Hashanah and Kol Nidrei.

Nursing mothers are advised to use the crèche if they require some privacy. Changing facilities can be found in the ladies' toilets.

We are delighted that children's entertainer, Ilana Banana will be involved in our creche Services on 1st Day Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.




FOOD FOR UNDER 13s ON YOM KIPPUR

Do you have to leave early on Yom Kippur to feed your children? Do you want to stay in the main service while your kids are fed and looked after?

Well we have the SOLUTION for you! A dedicated group of volunteers will be preparing lunch packs for children to eat following the Family Service on Yom Kippur.

Lunch packs will include:

- Sandwich (cream cheese or strawberry jam)
- Crisps
- Cake
- Apple
- Carton of juice

Lunch packs must be ordered in advance by Monday 7 October.

The hall is also available following the youth services for any congregant who is unable to fast due to health concerns

CAR PARKING ARRANGEMENTS

There are no parking facilities at the synagogue. It would be helpful if, as many members as possible share cars, use public transport or walk.

There are very few pay and display bays in the area. The Residential Controlled Parking in the Belsize Park area CA-B is from 9.00am - 6.30pm Monday to Friday and 9.30am – 1.30pm on Saturday. We have some residents parking vouchers available from the Synagogue Office. Please note that you can only have a maximum of 4 hours permits on display in your car at any time. After 4 hours it will be necessary to move your car and put more vouchers on display.

Vouchers cost £2 per hour. The maximum number of vouchers that can be purchased is **12 hours** which would cover all daytime services. To purchase vouchers please make payment through the website (www.synagogue.org.uk/payment). No vouchers can be bought or collected at services and must be posted or picked up before.

Drivers who have a "**Blue/Orange** badge" may park in the area in the usual way, in accordance with the rules laid out by the Council who issued the badge.

There is a car park under the Swiss Cottage Odeon (Regency Car Park) at a cost of £19 per day which can be booked directly on www.parking-here.com

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Please use public transport wherever possible.

Underground: Belsize Square Synagogue is equidistant from Belsize Park (Northern Line) and Swiss Cottage (Jubilee Line) underground stations. We are also walkable from Finchley Road Station (Jubilee and Metropolitan Line).

Overground Trains: Finchley Road and Frognal are the closest stations.

Thames Link: West Hampstead then Jubilee Line to Finchley Road or Swiss Cottage Underground Stations.

Buses: 1 Holborn Station to Royal Free Hospital; 13 North Finchley via Golders Green to Swiss Cottage; 46 Kings Cross to Swiss Cottage; 113 Edgware to Swiss Cottage; 187 O2 Centre to Swiss Cottage; 268 Finchley Road Underground Station the O2 Centre, and Golders Green to St Peter's Church Belsize Square; 603 Muswell Hill to Swiss Cottage; C11 Archway to Brent Cross.

NB Route 168 no longer runs and has been replaced by route 1

We would love to welcome your family and friends to our Services. Attendance at Services is by ticket only so please order them through the office or on the website. Adult tickets are £60 and children up to the age of 21 years are free but must have a valid ticket.

In the interests of security, each ticket will be numbered and allocated to a specific name. Tickets are not transferable. Please note that each ticket covers all High Holyday Services; reduced price tickets for individual services are not available.

Tickets will not be available for collection at Services.
